  - Attended by roughly 80 DoD (OSD, Navy, A/F, USMC and Army) representatives

## *Mod & Sim Direction*

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- “The PM shall plan for M&S throughout the acquisition life cycle.”
- “The PM shall identify and fund required M&S resources early in the life cycle.”

# General Issues & Concerns

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- M&S applications should be employed through all Logistics and Sustainment phases as they can reduce risk and cost throughout the system acquisition life cycle
- Need to have tailorable (vs one-time) M&S resources
  - Be careful for one size fits all
- Lack of awareness and insufficient details available for M&S models and resources
- Difficulty assessing the true capabilities and limitations of existing M&S resources
- M&S components do not work (talk & integrate) well together in some cases
  - M&S needs to be joint and interoperable
- Data repositories are as key and important as the M&S architecture that uses them; accuracy and completeness supports optimum decisions

# General Issues & Concerns (cont'd)

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- Little insight into how M&S resources have been used in the past including success and failures (Val/Ver) (Workshop Panel Discussions?)
- Need to strengthen the Government/Industry partnership network - programs can fail if there are not strong partnerships (i.e. CRADA) (Workshop Discussion Topic)
- Community needs to understand licensing, support and procurement of the M&S resource
  - Community needs to understand proprietary rights and concerns
- DoD needs to issue policy and/or guidance along with a guidebook to strongly encourage PMs to select from the “best of the best” and/or “best of breed” M&S products and processes relative to operational availability, reliability and ownership cost – this will directly assist the DoD to solve their logistics and sustainment issues
  - PMs should document this early in their acquisition plans – complementary and interoperable

# Availability Definition

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- DoD RAM-C Manual of 1 June provides the following definitions, along with some examples, some clarification of when an item should be included in the calculations and guidance on how to compute during various phases of a program:
  - Materiel Availability ( $A_M$ ) =  $\frac{\text{\# of operational end items}}{\text{Total \# of end items acquired}}$
  - Operational Availability ( $A_O$ ) =  $\frac{\text{Uptime}}{\text{Uptime} + \text{downtime}}$
- DoD RAM-C Manual does NOT provide:
  - Reporting periodicity requirements (daily, weekly, monthly, etc.)
  - Specific guidance on measuring Uptime and Downtime
  - Details on depot items and off-line items when computing  $A_O$
- There continues to exist the opportunity for well-meaning people to compute different values for these factors given the same circumstances
- Recommend a focused industry/government effort over the next 6 – 12 months to more fully develop the math, data elements and reporting periodicity associated with these terms.

# Reliability Data & Prediction Standard Improvement

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- Issues / Concerns
  - Reliability is the number one most critical parameter to Mission Assurance
    - Operational Availability
    - O&S Costs
  - Reliability predictions / tools have improved over the years, but current predictions and data still inaccurate under certain circumstances, e.g. Harsh Environments
- Recommended Solutions
  - Continue to fund Reliability Prediction Standard Improvements
  - Incentivize Government and Industry to collect Reliability data on fielded product, and develop Government / Industry data base(s)

# Cost Estimation

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- Issues / Concerns

- Improvements in cost estimation have been made over the past several years in improving TOC / LCC estimates
  - WBS Standards
- Significant Effort is needed in Cost Estimating Relationship (CER) development / standardization (Workshop Discussion Topic)
  - No standard CERs currently exist!
    - Especially true for D&D and P&D!
- Cost needs to be Embraced on an Equal footing with Performance!

- Recommended Solutions

- Adopt the current best-of-breeds as a standard
- Fund development of new standard CERs, and incorporation into a standard tool-set
